

SEXUAL ASSAULT

1. If you are a victim of sexual assault:
 - Get to a safe place as soon as possible (home, your friend's room, a familiar place at the university etc.).
 - Call out for help – notify the police as soon as possible – **997 (or 112)**, as well as Rector's Proxy for Security Affairs - **501 556 557**, especially when the incident happened on the campus. Do not delay reporting it. University personnel will assist any student who is the victim of a sex offence in notifying the police, in obtaining medical assistance, informing your relatives and in pursuing counseling.
 - Preserve all physical evidence. If possible, do not bathe, take a shower, eat, drink, smoke, urinate, brush your teeth or change your clothes, since you may destroy evidence. If you have changed your clothes, put the clothes you were wearing at the time of the rape into a paper bag, for further examination.
 - Seek medical attention at the nearest hospital emergency room. Ask somebody you trust to be with you.
2. If a student was assaulted by another student, apart from bringing charges against the perpetrator in criminal court, the victim may also seek recourse through the university disciplinary process.
3. If the accused student is found guilty of the alleged sex offence, expulsion from the university will occur.
